I want to thank you for your past involvement and support, and I look forward to your continued participation and enthusiasm in this coming year.


Our dedicated volunteer Board worked hard this past year to plan and provide a slate of enriching, fun, and memorable events and programs.

MyDogDNA Genetic Testing for the Chinook

Ever wondered about your Chinook's genetic diversity and how it compares to other Chinooks or dogs in general? Curious about your dog's genetic information related to disease, coat color, or ear set? MyDogDNA now has genetic analyses that may begin to help answer these questions (and many more).



How does genetic testing benefit the Chinook breed?

Simply put, genetic testing provides information that can be used to improve the health of the Chinook breed. As you probably know, Chinooks are rare- with only about 2500 Chinooks EVER since 1917 (currently ~1200 are alive). Conse-

quently, the breeding population is small compared to other breeds. Higher genetic diversity has been linked to improved health including stronger immune systems and increased longevity. MyDogDNA provides a genetic diversity/health index where you can see how your dog

compares to other Chinooks and to other similar breeds. Breeders can then use this information to make better breeding decisions and improve the genetic diversity (and consequently the health) of the Chinook breed.



As an example, the graphs in this article show the MyDogDNA results from an Alaskan Malamute. The blue curve of the Genetic Diversity graph (left) shows the diversity of all Alaskan Malamutes. The blue circle is where the individual dog's genetic diversity lies on this curve. In this example, the dog is genetically less diverse than the average population. In the Genetic Relationships cluster graph (right), each Malamute is represented by a circle. Those near the blue circle are more closely related to this dog than those farther away. If this dog's breeder was looking for a very diverse breeding partner, they should consider those dogs in the lower right or left clusters.

Why is MyDogDNA important to breeders?

MyDogDNA Breeder provides you with the ability to choose the dog you are considering breeding, and then lists all possible breeding partners with a predicted genetic diversity/health index rating for the offspring. MyDogDNA also provides coat color and length, ear set, and other genetic information. Currently, there are no known genetic tests for inherited diseases in the Chinook. However, this test includes a potential screening for dwarfism (article in next CQ).

Why is MyDogDNA important to stud owners?

If you have a stud you are hoping to have used, this is a GREAT way to give breeders additional information about him that may make him even more attractive to the right partner.


How much is it and what does it entail?

The COA has arranged a group discount with Genoscoper's MyDogDNA 2015 test for breeders and owners looking for answers to the questions above! Available online for 99 Euros, the COA

has negotiated a 20% discount for a final cost of 79 Euros, or around \$88 per test! This discount is valid for a LIMITED TIME ONLY – kits must be purchased at www.mydogdna.com during the month of September, with the discount code CHINOOK.

The test is three cheek swabs. MyDogDNA recommends having the dog identified via microchip scanner/tattoo by a licensed vet and having the vet do the test, but technically anyone can take these very simple samples from their own dog.

In addition to helping breeders make better breeding decisions, the COA Health Committee agrees that this new information will build on the data from the Chinook Pedigree Project. This will help the COA develop, in part-



nership with population geneticists, the best action plan to ensure the Chinook breed has a sustainable genetic future. We encourage all Chinook owners and especially breeders and stud owners to participate. If we can add 30+ Chinooks to the MyDogDNA database by the fourth quarter, Chinook population information (similar to the Malamute example in this article) will be published.



GRCH Cloudburst Kennebec River, "Kenne", RBIMBS, CGC, TDI, DNA-VIP left this world on June 10, 2015. Kennebec joined our family in August of 2001 and changed our lives forever. Kenne was the most amazing dog – he has a place in our hearts that no other dog will ever have. We began to bond with him the second he crawled into John's lap as a three week old pup while we sat in the whelping box. He chose us and it was a match made in heaven. Kennebec was a first of a kind in Chinook history. He was the first male Cross-to-Pure, first male Cross-to-Pure to earn the UKC Champion title and the first Chinook in the history of the breed to earn UKC Grand Champion title coming out of the cross program. From his flash in the pan show career, which was class dog to grand champion in 9 shows, earning 3 best of breed wins as a class dog, we knew how special he was. He had an amazing start earning Best of Breed and Reserve Best in Multibreed Show his first time in the ring as a new cross to pure class dog.

What was most amazing about Kenne was his heart. He knew what he was bred for and took lead position on our sled team and never gave it up. He had the heart of a lion and pulled because he loved us. We could see Chinook himself in him. Many Chinook owners told us that he was the closest thing to Chinook they had ever seen. Kenne pulled into his 10th year. We could tell he was tiring yet he pulled with everything he had often pulling the sled, musher, and the entire team along. It was time for him to retire. We knew it was the right thing yet we saw the disappointment in his eyes.

Kenne was a wonderful stud dog. He produced very typy pups to carry on his legacy. We are fortunate to have a couple of his daughters, grand and great grandkids living with us.

There is a very large void at Granite Hill that cannot be filled. Kennebec will be alive in our hearts forever. Godspeed beautiful boy. We hope you know how much you were loved.
